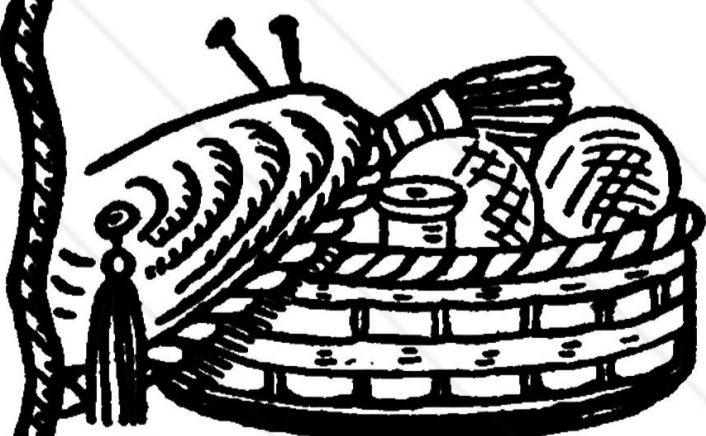

## PANSY PAN HOLDERS

### As Shown on Front Cover

To make this pan holder we have used about number 20 crochet thread in cream and lavender or purple—approximately 60 yards of each—but other desirable colors may be used. You will also need 1 skein each of six-strand floss in orange and light green; use a size 7 crochet hook.

Abbreviations: ch (chain); st (stitch); lps (loops); sp (space); sk (skip); r (ring); sl st (slip stitch); sc (single crochet); dc (double crochet); hdc (half double crochet)—to make hdc, thread over hook once, insert hook in st and draw thread through (3 lps now on hook), thread over hook, draw through all 3 lps at once. Tr (treble); dtr (double treble)—to make dtr, thread over hook 3 times, work off two lps at a time.

Petal—Rnd (round) 1: In color, ch 6, tr in starting st, (ch 1, dtr) 4 times in same st, ch 1, tr in same st, ch 5, sl st in same st.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, turn, (sc, ch 1, sc) in 5-ch lp, (ch 1, dc) twice in next 1-ch sp, (ch 1, tr) 3 times in each of next 3 sps, (ch 1, dc) twice in next sp, (ch 1, sc) twice in 5-ch lp, ch 3, sl st in center starting st.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in 3-ch, 3 hdc in next 1-ch sp between sc, 3 dc in next 1-ch sp, (3 tr in next sp) twice, (3 dtr in next sp) 8 times, (3 tr in next sp) twice, 3 dc in next sp, 3 hdc in next sp between sc, sc in next 3-ch and drop thread, but do not cut.

Rnd 4: Turn, in cream sl st in last sc, sc in next 10 sts, hdc in 2 sts, (2 dc in next st) 3 times, (1 tr in next st, 2 tr in next) twice, (1 dtr in next st, 2 dtr in each of next 2 sts) 3 times, 1 dtr in next st, (2 tr in next st, 1 tr in next) twice, (2 dc in

next st) 3 times, hdc in 2 sts, sc in 10 sts, 1 sl st in end st.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, sc in next 9 sc, (hdc in 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st) twice, (dc in 2 sts, 2 dc in next st) twice, (1 tr in next st, 2 tr in each of next 2 sts) 7 times, 1 tr in next st, (2 dc in next st, dc in 2 sts) twice, (2 hdc in next st, hdc in 2 sts) twice, sc in 9 sts.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, turn, sk 1 sc, sc in 4 sts, hdc in 3 sts, 2 dc in next st, (dc in 2 sts, 2 dc in next st) 23 times, 3 hdc, 4 sc and 1 sl st; fasten off.

Rnd 7: Turn and pick up color, 4 dc down in center (starting) st, sk next cream sl st, 4 sc at base of next sc, inserting hook under sc into previous rnd 5, 4 hdc at base of next fourth st, (4 dc in third st of rnd 5, at base of 2-dc-widening) 24 times, 4 hdc at base of next third st, 4 sc at base of next fourth st, sl st in first dc.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, turn, 1 sc in each st around, join and fasten off.

Rnd 9: Turn, sk last 4 sc, sl st in cream in next st, (ch 3, sl st in next 2 sc) repeated around to fourth st from start; fasten off. Make 5 petals.

Center—In orange floss, ch 7, sl st in first st. Ch 3, 14 dc in r, sl st in 3-ch; fasten off. Tack petals to center by 3 dc at center of base of each petal sewn to 3 dc on r. Lap right top petal over left top petal, side petals over top petals, and lower petal over side petals. Tack together  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch from edge on back. In green floss, embroider a "V" from center down on lower petal, with 5 long stitches in orange out on petal. Make 3 long orange sts put on each side petal. Steam and press dry on back through a cloth. Line back with muslin and sew a bone ring to top.

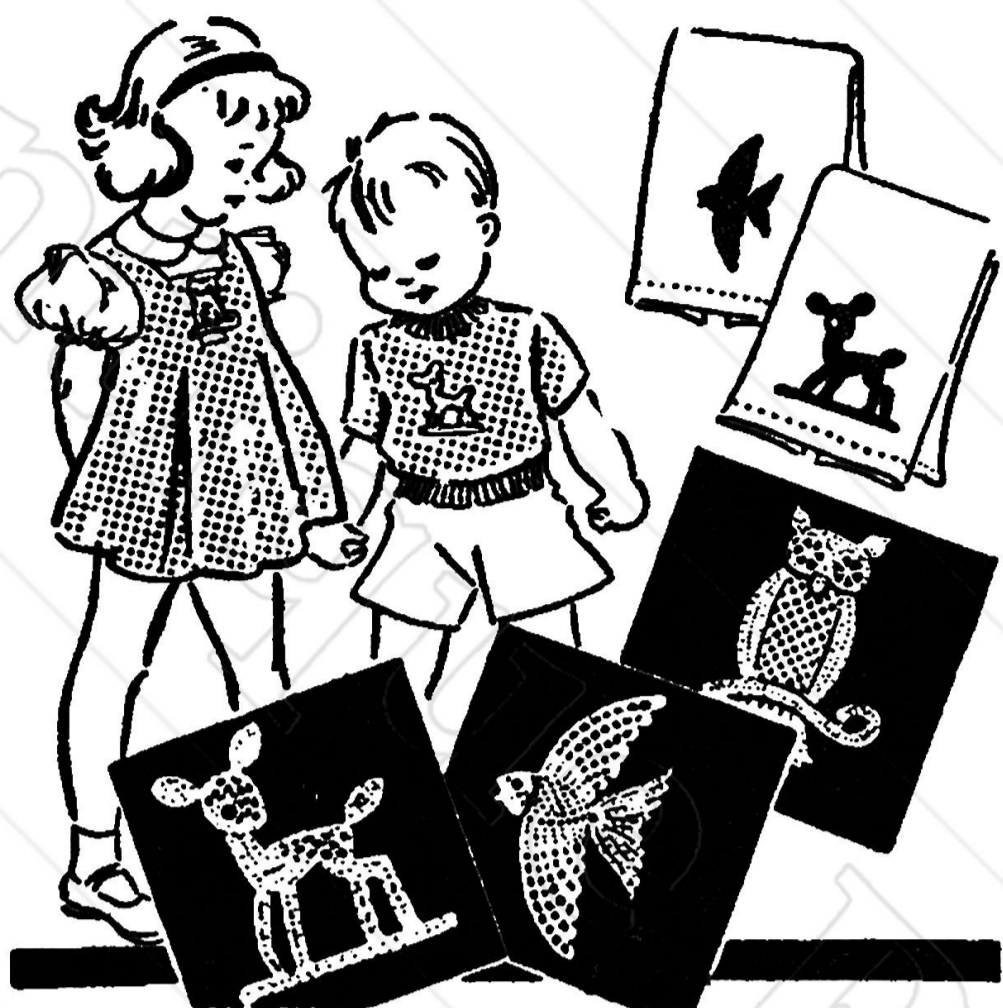

## CROCHETED ANIMALS

Make these cute crocheted animals and sew several of them on the front of a plain colored sweater; or applique one or two on front of a child's dress, sun suit, towel or bib. These were made from size 30 crochet thread, and take approximately 10 yards; use a size 12 crochet hook.

### FAWN

**Head:** Starting at eye, ch (chain) 9, sl st (slip stitch) in first st (stitch). Ch 1, 1 sc (single crochet), 7 hdc (half double crochet) and 6 sc in ring, sl st in first sc. Ch 1, (2 sc in next st) twice, (ch 3, sc in next st) 5 times, sc in next st. Ch 3, turn, sc in next lp (loop) (ch 2, sc in next lp) 4 times, 1 more sc in same lp, sc in next 4 sc. Ch 2, turn, hdc in last 2 sc, sl st in next, ch 1, sc in next 3 sts, \* 2 sc in next lp, ch 9, a 4-dtr (double treble) crochet-(to make dtr, thread over hook 3 times, insert hook in st and work off 2 lps at a time; to make dtr cluster retain last lp of each dtr on hook, thread over and pull through all lps on hook to form dtr cluster) cluster in 9th ch st from hook, ch 3. sl st in cluster for a p (picot), ch 9, sl st at base of cluster, 1 sc in same lp of last row, \* (3 sc in next lp) twice. Repeat from \* to \* for second ear. 3 sc in next lp, sc in next 6 dc, ch 1, (1 hdc and 2 dc) in next st, sl st in first 2-ch. Fasten off.

**BODY:** Row 1: Ch 25 for hind leg, a 3-tr (treble) cluster in 6th st from hook, ch 3, sl st in cluster for a p, ch 6,

sl st at base of cluster, for tail, ch 18, turn, sk (skip) last ch st, sc in next 4 sts, 3 sc in next st, 1 sc in next, (ch 2, sc in next third st) 3 times, ch 1, sk cluster, sc in next ch st, ch 2, sc in next third st, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, sk next 2 sts, sc in remaining 9 sts.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in last 8 sc, sk 2 sc in angle, sc in next 3 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next sc, ch 2, sc in next 2-ch lp, ch 1, sk 1-ch sp (space) in angle, sc in next 2-ch lp, (ch 2, sc in next lp) twice, ch 2, sc in next second sc, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in last 6 sc, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next lp, (ch 2, sc in next lp) twice, ch 1, sk 1-ch sp in angle, sc in next 2-ch lp, sc in next 3 sc. Ch 1, turn, sc in last 4 sc, sk 1-ch sp in angle, sc in next 2-ch lp, ch 2, sc in next lp, sc in last 9 sc, 3 sc in next st, 1 sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in end sc. Ch 1, turn, sc in last 9 sc, 3 sc in next st, 1 st, in next st, hdc in next 5 sts, 1 sc in next st, sc in next 2-ch sp, ch 1, a 2-dc cluster in next st, sl st in next corner, sl st in next 2 sts, ch 9, turn, sk last ch st, 8 sc on ch, sl st in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn, sk 2 sl sts, sc in next 8 sc. Cut thread 3 inches long.

**Front Legs:** Turn, join to outside corner at base of neck, \*\* ch 13, turn sk last ch st, \* sc in next 3 sts, (sc in next 2 sts) worked off together into a decrease. Repeat from \* once. Sc in next 2 sts, sl st in next 2 sts on lower side of body. Ch 1, turn, sc in 10 sc. Cut thread 3 inches long \*\*. Turn, join to next sc on under side of body and repeat from \*\* to \*\*.

**Base:** Ch 7, sc in end of first back leg, ch 2, sc in next back leg, ch 11, sc in next front leg, ch 2, sc in next front leg, ch 10, turn, sk last 3 ch sts, dc in next 7 sts, and working over ends left from legs, make 1 dc in sc, 2 dc in next 2-ch, dc in sc, 11 dc over next 11-ch, dc in sc, 2 dc in next 2-ch, dc in sc, 6 dc over next 7-ch, 1 dc in end st. Fasten off. Sew center of lower side of head over top of neck.

### FLYING FISH

**Body:** Starting at eye, for head and body, ch 10, sl st in first st. Ch 1, 16



sc in ring, sl st in first sc. Ch 1, sc in next 4 sc, 2 hdc in next sc, ch 2, sl st in last hdc for a p, 1 hdc and 1 sl st in same sc, ch 2, (1 hdc, a 2-ch p and 1 hdc) in next sc (mouth made), dc in 2 sc, 2 tr in next sc, a 3-tr cluster in next sc, ch 1, 6 sc over bar of last tr, sc in next 7 sts. Ch 1, turn, sc in last sc, (ch 3, sc in next second sc) 6 times. \* Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) 5 times. Repeat from \* 3 times. Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) repeated across to second lp from end, ch 2, dc in end lp. \*\* Ch 3, turn, sc in next 3-ch lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) repeated to second lp from end, ch 2, dc in end lp. Repeat from \*\* 3 times (only 2 lps in final row). Ch 4, turn, sc in next lp.

**Tail:** Ch 21, turn, sk 1 st, 20 sc on ch, sl st in last 4-ch lp on body. Ch 1, turn and working in back lps throughout, sc in back lps of last 17 sc. Ch 1, turn, 14 sc. Ch 1, turn, 11 sc. Ch 1, turn, 9 sc. (Ch 1, turn, 6 sc) twice, sc down in 2 sc at end of previous rib, 3 sc down in previous rib, sl st in same 4-ch lp. Ch 1, turn, 9 sc. Ch 1, turn, 6 sc. (Ch 1, turn, 5 sc) twice, sc down in next 3 sc, sl st in same 4-ch lp. Ch 1, turn, 8 sc. Ch 3, turn, 2 sc on ch, sc in next 4 sc. Ch 1, turn, 6 sc. Ch 3, turn, 2 sc on ch, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next rib. Ch 1, turn, 10 sc. Ch 4, turn, 3 sc on ch, 10 sc, 2 sc in next rib, sl st in same 4-ch. Ch 1, turn, 15 sc. Ch 4, turn, 3 sc on ch, 15 sc, sl st in same 4-ch lp. Ch 1, turn, 18 sc. Ch 4, turn, 3 sc on ch, 18 sc, sl st in same 4-ch lp. Fasten off.

**Top Fin:** Turn and join again at top end of sc-row forming back edge of head. \* Ch 37, sk 1 st, 36 sc on ch, sl st in next open sp on top of body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st and working in back lps throughout, sc in next 8 sc, (ch 3, sc in next third sc) 8 times, dc in next third sc. Ch 1, turn, (2 sc in next 3-ch lp, 3 sc in next) 4 times, sc in 7 sc, sl st in next open sp on body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 6 sc, (ch 3, sc in next third sc) 6 times, dc in next third sc. Ch 1, turn, (3 sc in next 3-ch lp) 6 times, sc in next 5 sc, sl st in same sp on body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 5 sc, (ch 3, sc in next third sc) 5 times, dc

in next third sc. Ch 1, turn, (2 sc in next lp, 3 sc in next) twice, 2 sc in next lp, sc in next 4 sc, sl st in next sp on body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 4 sc, (ch 3, sc in next 3rd sc) 3 times, dc in next 3rd sc. Ch. 1, turn, 3 sc in next lp, 2 sc in next, 3 sc in next, sc in 3 sc, sl in next sp on body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 2 sc, (ch 3, sc in next third sc) twice, dc in next third sc. Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in next lp, 3 sc in next, 1 sc in next sc, sl st in next sp on body. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, sc in next 3 sc, dc in next third sc. Ch 1, turn, sk dc, (1 sc, 1 hdc, and 1 dc) across, sl st in next second sp. Ch 1, turn, sk sl st, 3 sc, (1 sc, ch 2, 3 dc, ch 2, 1 sc) all in each of next 5 open sps between ribs, (1 sc, ch 2, and 4 dc) in end sp, ch 2, sl st in end rib. Fasten off.

**Lower Fin:** Without turning, join at other end of sc-row at back of head and repeat Top Fin beginning at \*.

### OWL

**Head:** Starting at eye, ch 7, dc in first st, (ch 3, dc in same st) 4 times, ch 3, sl st in 4th st of first 7-ch. Fasten off. Make one more circle, do not fasten off, ch 1, (4 sc in next 3 ch lp, 1 sc in dc) 5 times, 4 sc in next sp, sl st in first 1-ch. 1 sc in 1 dc on other circle, (4 sc in next 3-ch,) sc in dc 5 times, sk 4 sc on other circle between eyes, sl st in back lp of next sc, ch 4 and in back lps, 1 dc in next 2 sc, 1 hdc in next, 1 sc in next, sl st in next, ch 5, a 3-dc cluster for one ear in same st, ch 4, sl st in cluster for a p, ch 3, sl st down in same sc on circle, (ch 1, sl st in next sc) repeated around to joining of circles, ch 4, 5 dc in joining, remove hook, insert it back in 4-ch, catch lp and pull through, for a popcorn st which forms nose. (Ch 1, sl st in next sc) repeated around next circle to 8th sc from end, ch 3, a 3-dc cluster for other ear in same st, a 4-ch p, ch 5, sl st in same sc on circle, sc in next 2 sc, hdc in next, dc in next 2 sc, sl st in first 4-ch. Fasten off.

**Body:** Starting at top, ch 15, turn, sc in 5th st from hook, (ch 3, sc in next second ch st) 5 times.

**Row 2:** Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) 5 times. Repeat row 2 twelve times. Ch 5, turn, sc in



last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) twice, sc in next lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) twice. Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) 4 times. Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, ch 3, sc in next 2 lps, (ch 3, sc in next lp) twice. Ch 5, turn, sc in last lp, (ch 3, sc in next lp) 3 times. Repeat this last row once. Fasten off. Turn, 1 sc in starting st, 4 sc in first sp down side, 4 hdc in next, (4 dc in next) 5 times, 4 hdc in next, (4 sc in next lp) 3 times, 4 sc in next along side, 4 hdc in next sp, (4 dc in next) 5 times, 4 hdc in next, 4 sc in next, 2 sc. Ch 1, turn and in back lps make 4 sc, 22 hdc and 10 sc down to corner, sl st in

next sc, ch 10 for tail, turn, sk last ch st, 9 sc on ch, sl st in next sc on body, \*\* ch 1, turn, sk sl st and in back lps, sc in next 8 sc, ch 3, turn, sk 2 ch sts, 1 sc in third ch st, sc in next 8 sc, sl st in next second sc on body. Repeat from \*\* 5 times. Sc in next 10 sts, hdc in each st to 5th from end, sc in remaining 4 sc. Fasten off. Lap head over top edge of body and sew together.

Twig: Ch 60, sk 2 sts, (2 hdc in next st) 15 times, 1 hdc in each remaining st. Ch 1, turn and in back lps, 1 sc in each hdc. Sl st in 19th st from last end to fasten. Tack across owl at top of tail.



### CROCHETED BABY BOOTIES

Inexpensive baby gifts that you can make quickly and easily, are always in demand. Here is a pair of baby booties that require only a small amount of 2-ply baby wool and about a yard of narrow ribbon. Use a number 1 or 2 bone crochet hook.

Starting at the ankle, ch chain) 30 very loosely. Join with sl st (slip stitch) to form a ring. Ch 5, and holding last loop of each st (stitch) on hook, make a dc (double crochet) where sl st was made, sk (skip) 1 ch, make a dc in next ch, yarn over hook, and pull yarn through all loops at once, ch 2 (Pineapple st made). \* Holding last loop of each st on hook, make dc in same st with last dc, sk 1 ch, make dc in next ch, yarn over, pull yarn through all loops, ch 2. Repeat from \* around (15 pineapple st); join last ch 2 to 3rd ch of begin-

ning ch 5. Repeat this row twice more making pineapple st in ch 2 sp (space).

Turn, and holding last loop of each st on hook, pull up 5 more loops through 5 ch st along original ch 30 (you have 6 loops on hook). Work off loops 2 at a time 5 times (6 Afghan st). Pull up 5 more loops along last row and work off as before. Make 6 rows in all of afghan st.

FOOT: Make a row of dc around ankle and instep with 3 dc in each corner st at toe. Rows 2 and 3: Dc in each dc around.

SOLE: Turn work inside out, make a row of hdc (half double crochet) around, catching front loop of each st only. At toe, dec (decrease) by making 3 hdc, holding last loop of each st on hook, yarn over, and work off all loops at once. Make one row of hdc, fold edges together and seam with a row of sc (single crochet). Fasten off, and turn bootie right side out. Work a decorative row of sc around sole, fasten off.

CUFF: Join thread at top of a pineapple st, ch 3, make 4 dc in same place as ch 3, \* ch 1, sk 1 pineapple st, sc in next sp, ch 1, sk 1 pineapple st, make 5 dc in tip of next pineapple st. Repeat from \* around (5 shells), ending with ch 1, sk 1 pineapple st, sc in next sp, sk 1 pineapple st, ch 1, sl st in top of first ch 3. Make 2 more rows of shells, making sc between shells in 3rd dc of shell below. Make 1 row of sc around top of booties in silk crochet thread.



Thread a ribbon about 16 inches long around ankle through bottom row of pineapple st, tie in bow. Make another bootie like first.

### CROCHETED BABY CARRIAGE ROBE

This dainty yet practical carriage robe is made of medium weight cotton rug yarn and requires about 7 skeins of color, pink or blue preferably, and 3 skeins of white. It could also be made in a 4-ply wool yarn. Use a size 0 crochet hook.

In color, ch (chain) 124, sk (skip) first ch, sc (single crochet) in next 3 ch, \* sk 3 ch, (dc—double crochet, ch 1, dc) in next ch, ch 2, (dc, ch 1, dc) in same st (stitch), sk 3 ch, sc in next 3 ch. Repeat from \* across, ch 3, turn.

Row 2: Sk first st, dc in next 2 sc, \* (dc, ch 1, dc) in center sp (space) of next shell, ch 2, (dc, ch 1, dc) in same shell, dc in 3 st between shells. Repeat from \* across. Repeat row two 44 times or until robe is as long as desired, ch 3, turn.

Dc in next 2 dc, \* ch 2, sc in 2nd dc of next shell, sc in ch 2 sp, sc in next dc, ch 2, 3 dc in dc between shells. Repeat from \* across, ch 3, turn.

EDGE: Dc in next 2 dc, \* 2 dc in ch 2 sp, dc in 3 dc, 2 dc in ch 2 sp, dc in 3 dc. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. On other end, make 1 dc in each st, with 3 dc in each ch 3 sp.

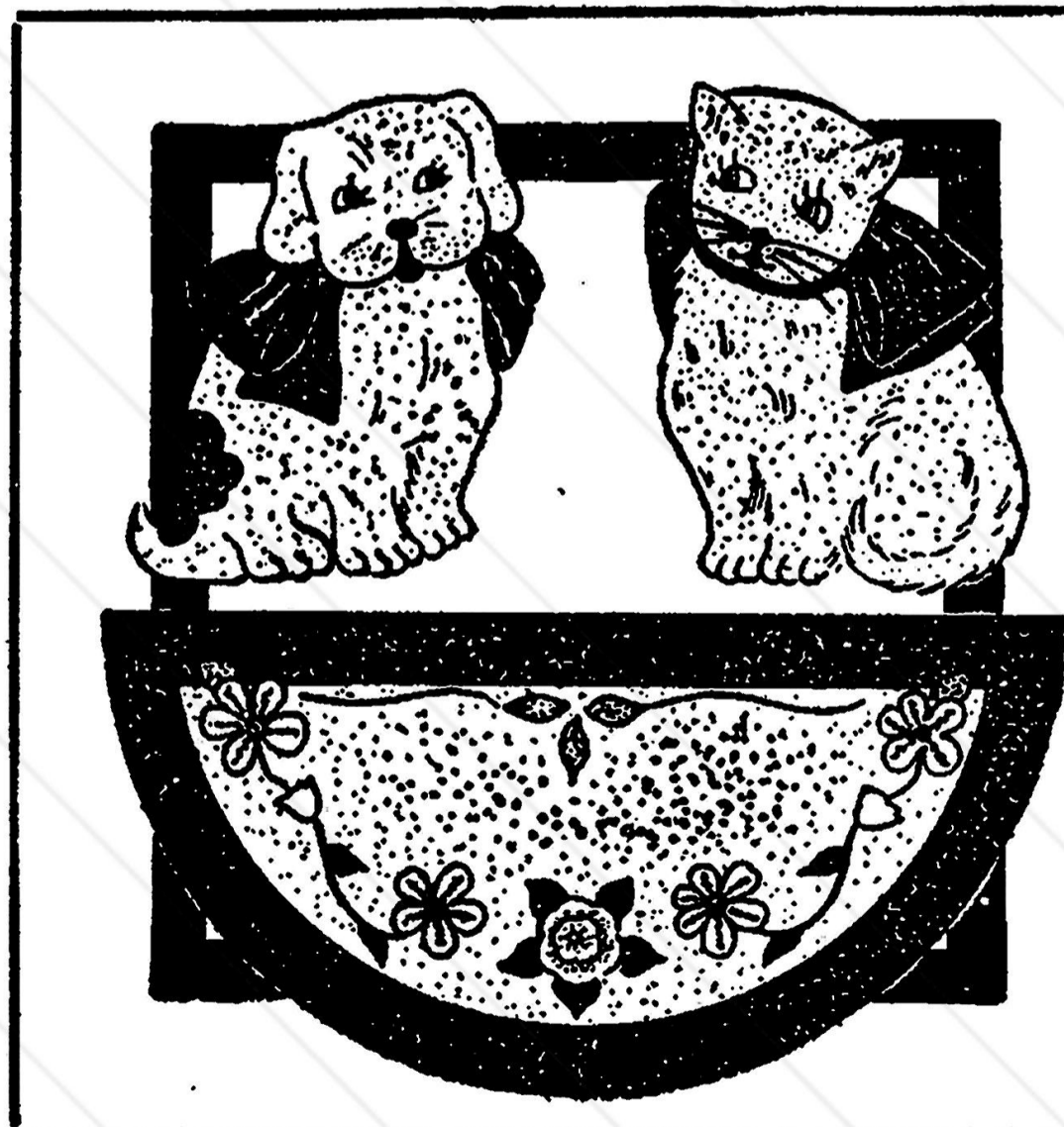
**BORDER:** Join white to one corner, and, working across end, ch 5, holding back on hook last loop of each st, dc in same corner st, sk 2 dc, dc in next dc, yarn over and pull hook through all 3 loops at once (a cross st), \* ch 2, holding last loop of each st, dc in same st with last dc, sk 2 dc, dc in next dc, made into a cross st as before. Repeat from \* to next corner. (Ch 2, dc) 3 times in corner and continue around robe in cross st. On long sides make cross st at base of each dc. End row with (ch 2, dc) twice, ch 2, sl st in 3rd ch of first ch 5.

Row 2: Sl st in next ch 2 sp, ch 5, make a cross st in same sp and next sp, \* ch 2, cross st in same sp and next sp to 2nd sp from corner, ch 2, dc in same sp, ch 2, dc in next sp. Repeat from \* around. Make 3 more rows. At corners, inc (increase) with (ch 2, dc) twice in corner sp.

**EDGE:** Sl st in next sp, \* ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (picot made), ch 1, sc in next sp. Repeat from \* around; fasten off.

**FLOWER:** In color, \* ch 4, dc, ch 3, sl st in 4th ch from hook. Repeat from \* 5 times. Sl st at base of first petal, fasten off. Make 4 flowers. Sew one on each corner of border. Make a large white French knot in center of each.

Pin robe right side down on large padded surface, stretching until pattern is opened up, steam and press dry through a cloth.



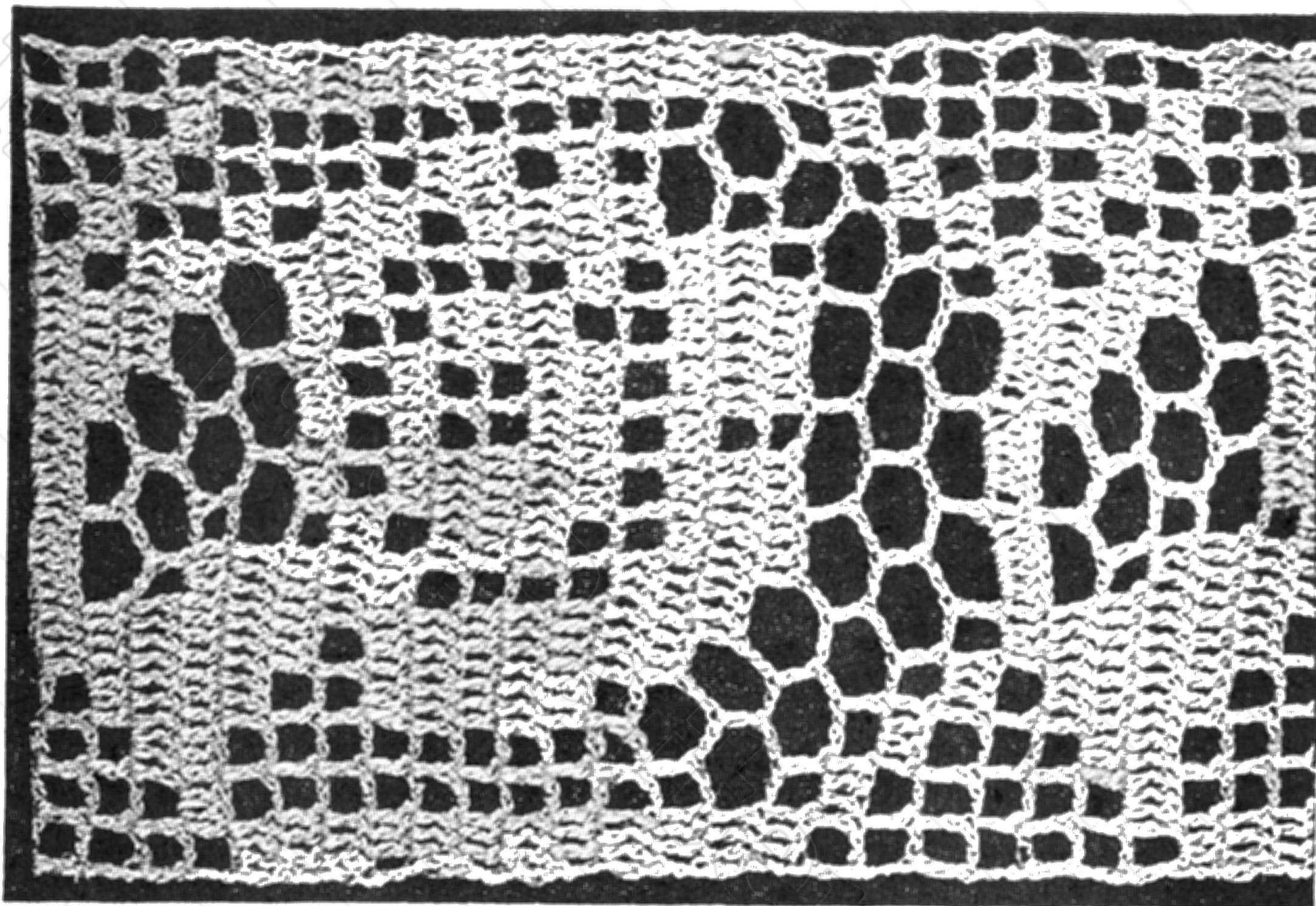
### HOOKED RUGS

These are ideal rug hooking days. Here are three unusually attractive designs stamped on burlap. The popular half circle is about 30 inches long, and may be made larger by a wider border. The playful pup and adorable kitten will win everybody's heart; about 28 inches tall, they may be finished in outline as shown or a border may be added.

You will receive stamped burlap for the rug (any design you choose), instructions for hooking your own rugs and directions for making rug hooking frames. Each piece about 24x30 inches.

### ROSE INSERTION

Especially designed for scarf ends and for sheet and pillow case ensembles, this wide insertion is quite effective when set above the hem. If made with silky-finish thread about size 20 with a number 10 steel hook, it measures about 3½ inches wide. Use finer thread for sheet and pillow slip ensembles. Work is begun at right end of motifs shown in the photograph.

Abbreviations: ch (chain); sk (skip); st (stitch); sps (spaces); bls (blocks); dc (double crochet).

Row 1: To begin, ch 53, sk 7 sts of ch, dc in next st, (ch 2, sk 2 sts of ch, dc in next st) 3 times; 1 dc in each of next 24 sts of ch making 25 dc in this group; (ch 2, sk 2 sts of ch, dc in next st) 4 times. Last dc should come in last st of beginning ch.

Row 2: Ch 5, turn, dc in next dc, (ch 2, sk 2 sts, dc in next dc) twice; 2 dc over next 2-ch, dc in next dc, ch 2, sk 2 dc, dc in each of next 7 dc, (ch 5, sk 5 dc, dc in next dc) twice, dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc over next 2-ch, dc in next dc, (ch 2,

sk 2 sts, dc in next dc) 3 times.

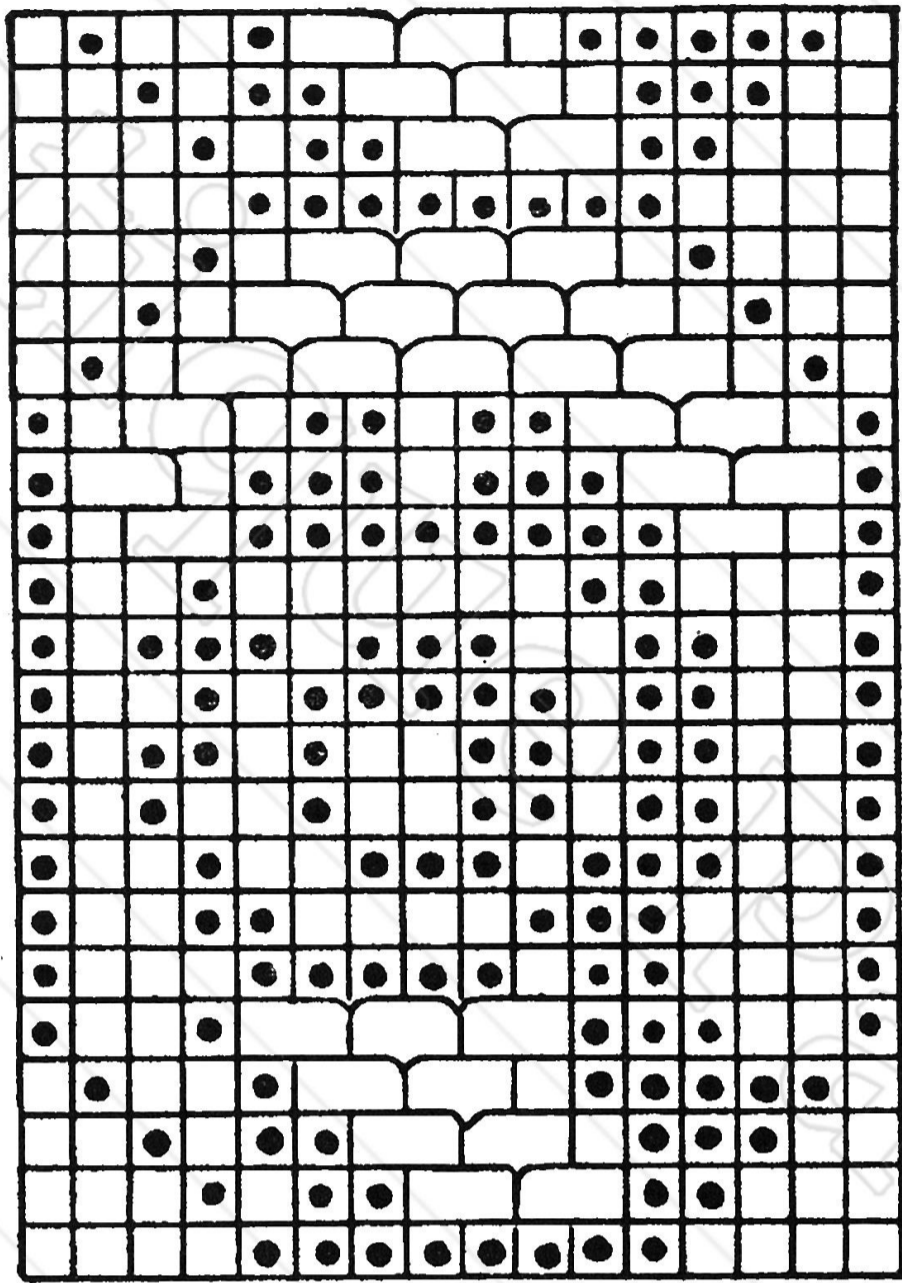
The work continues in filet pattern shown on the chart. Filet crochet is composed of sps and bls. Sps are shown on the chart by open squares and bls by dotted squares. A sp is formed by a dc, ch 2, sk 2 sts of previous row, dc in third st. A bl is composed of 4 dc. If worked over a sp, a dc is made in the dc of previous row, 2 dc are worked over the next 2-ch, dc in next dc. In working 2 or more adjoining bls, there will be 4 dc in the first bl and 3 dc in each additional bl. For large meshes shown on the chart, ch 5, sk 5 sts of previous row, dc in next st. In working over large meshes of previous row the dc will come in third (middle) st of 5-ch.

For remaining rows work according to chart as follows:

Row 3: Turn with ch 5, 2 sps, 10 dc in a group, ch 2, sk 2 sts, dc in third st of 5-ch, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next sp) repeat once but dc in 4th dc; 6 dc in a group, 1 sp, 1 bl of 4 dc, 2 sps.

Row 4: Turn with a ch 5 sp, 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc





**BEGIN**

in next st) twice; 1 sp, 16 dc in a group, 1 sp.

Row 5: Turn with ch 3, 3 dc to complete the bl, 2 sps, 10 dc in a group, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st) 3 times; 1 bl, 2 sps, 1 bl.

Row 6: Turn with ch 3, 1 bl, 3 sps, 16 dc in a group. In working these dc, make 5 dc over each of next two 5-chs with dc in dc between chs, dc in dc after second 5-ch, 2 dc over last 5-ch, dc in middle st of this 5-ch, ch 2, sk last 2 sts of this 5-ch, dc in next dc, 7 dc in a group, 3 sps, 1 bl.

Row 7 to 13 inclusive: work in a filet pattern as shown on the chart.

Row 14: 1 bl, 1 sp, ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next dc, 25 dc in a group, ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st, 1 sp, 1 bl.

Row 15: 1 bl, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st) twice; 10 dc in a group, 1 sp, 10 dc in a group, ch 2,

sk 2 sts, dc in next st, ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next, 3 dc to complete the bl.

Row 16: 1 bl, 1 sp, ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next, 1 sp, 7 dc in a group, 1 sp, 7 dc in a group, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st) twice; 1 sp, 1 bl.

Row 17: Turn with a ch 5, sk 2 dc, dc in next dc (a sp at edge), 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st) 5 times; 1 sp, 1 bl, 1 sp.

Row 18: Turn with ch 5, 2 sps, 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 5, sk 5 sts, dc in next st) 4 times; 1 sp, 1 bl, 2 sps.

Row 19: Turn with ch 5, 3 sps, 1 bl, 1 sp, (ch 5, sk 5 sts of ch, dc in next st) 3 times; 1 sp, 1 bl, 3 sps.

The next row will be the first row of a new motif and corresponds with Row 1. Turn with a ch 5, 4 sps, 25 dc in a group, working 2 dc over 2-ch, 5 dc over each 5-ch, dc in dc between chs, and 2 dc over 2-ch; dc in next dc, 4 sps. Work remainder of motif to correspond exactly with that already worked.

Continue to repeat motif until insertion is the desired length. When work is finished place it face down on padding and pin to an even width; press with a damp cloth and iron dry.

To remove fruit or vegetable stains from the hands, use lemon juice or a few drops of cuticle remover.
